Norman Manley Int'l Airport an excellent investment, Scott tells bidders

NMIA BIDDERS' CONFERENCE | 26 September 2017.
AAJ Learning and Development Centre , Palisadoes Kingston ,Jamaica.

Eight prospective bidders were approved to participate in the NMIA Public Private Partnership (PPP) transaction. Five of the prospective bidders attended the rescheduled NMIA Bidders Conference held on September 26th.

Development Bank of Jamaica (DBJ) Chairman Paul Scott encouraged bidders seeking to acquire the Norman Manley International Airport (NMIA) in Kingston by describing it as an "excellent investment" that will continue to record growth in passenger traffic.

"This is a great opportunity. If I knew before what I know today, I would be in the audience with you as a potential investor," Scott, who also chairs the NMIA Enterprise Team which was established by the Government to manage the privatisation of the airport, told the Bidders Conference.

Scott told the potential bidders that "there is no doubt that traffic to NMIA will continue to grow. There is not one person in Jamaica who does not have a relative abroad who wants to visit and be visited.

Hon. Dr. Horace Chang, minister without portfolio in the Ministry of Economic Growth and Job Creation with responsibility for water, works and housing, told the bidders that "the PPP will help Jamaica meet the demands of the global economy. It is part of the strategic plan to move the country towards a growth path and transportation is key if Jamaica is to participate effectively internationally".

Hon. Dr. Chang said that in positioning Jamaica as the number one Caribbean destination, NMIA will have to move several million passengers annually. "We look forward to working with you (the investors) to develop NMIA into the best airport in this hemisphere. When your investment is successful you make a profit, and we get many more visitors," Chang said.

Airports Authority of Jamaica President— Audley Deidrick pointed to a 2.8 per cent growth rate in tourism in Jamaica in 2016, the almost 80 per cent visiting friends and relatives traffic to Kingston and the availability of expansive cargo space as compelling factors which make the airport an excellent investment. He noted, too, that under the NMIA Capital Development Programme a number of projects have been implemented aimed at reducing airport operational risks, gaining efficiency in operations, reducing energy consumption, and expanding capacity. Deidrick assured the potential investors that while NMIA is up for privatisation "the programme of development now underway will continue right up to the point of transfer".

Michelle Ottey, transaction lead, International Finance Company (IFC) assured that the NMIA PPP arrangement will be a Concession agreement and will not involve the sale of the airport. "This is a strategic asset of the Government, and so it is not an outright divestment or sale of this asset. It is a long-term concession of the asset where the airport site and all immovable properties remain under the ownership of the Airports Authority. What is being granted is the exclusive rights to use these assets for the period of the concession," she said. Under the arrangement, the successful bidder will agree to a 25-year concession with the option to extend for five years by mutual consent. Concessionaire responsibilities focus on the commercial, financing and completing required works, operating the airport and improving efficiency, and maintaining and refurbishing the airport facilities.

The conference, which was held at the AAJ Learning and Development Centre, was designed to give the prospective bidders comprehensive information on the PPP and an opportunity to ask questions and seek clarification as they do their due diligence prior to presenting their bids.

Other presenters at the Bidders Conference were Walter Bernyck, counsellor and head of development corporation, Canadian High Commission and representative, Global Affairs Canada; and Michael Hepburn, director, economic regulations, Jamaica Civil Aviation Authority; Denise Arana, General Manager, PPP and privatisation, DBJ, moderated the conference. The prospective bidders also participated in a tour of the airport led by Airports Authority of Jamaica, a business luncheon hosted by JAMPRO, and one-on-one meetings with representatives of the NMIA Enterprise Team and the Government.

Cabinet, on July 2016, granted approval for the privatisation of NMIAL as a strategic priority for the Government, the establishment of the NMIA Enterprise Team, and engagement of DBJ as co-advisors. The IFC, a member of the World Bank Group, acts as lead advisors to the Jamaican Government.

A preferred bidder is expected to be selected and announced by April 2018.

NOW SHOWING

The diversity and endemism of Jamaica's flora is reflected in the island's flora. There are 60 genera and over 220 species of orchids. Thirty percent of the Jamaican orchid's population is endemic (approx. 66 species).

This high diversity may be accounted for by the variety of environmental habitats found on the island. Orchids are usually epiphytes (found on trees), there are

some that may be terrestrial or lithophytic (found on rocks). Most Jamaican species may be found in high mountainous and forested regions where they are adapted to the shade and the moisture of these regions. However, a few species may be found acclimatized to drier, sunny lowland and coastal regions.

The orchidaceae family is very unique with a range of different physical forms. Orchids are herbaceous monocotyledonous plants which are, mostly perennial. An orchid is distinctive mainly because of its floral characteristics. The flower is raised on a pedicel which rotates 180° during growth; the mature flower is now upside down. There are 3 petals and 3 sepal present and they are usually the same in colour. A distinctive feature of an orchid is the lip, two of the petals are lateral petals and the third is either lobed or cupped and is referred to as the lip or labellum.



Airport Protection Assistant Grade²

Airports Authority of Jamaica is an independent statutory body, with ownership and management oversight of the Ian Fleming International Airport (St Mary), Negril (Hanover), Ken Jones (Portland) Aerodromes, Tinson Pen (Kingston) Aerodrome, and Norman Manley International Airport (Kingston). Its mandate is to develop and operate a safe and secure airport system for Jamaica.

Airports Authority of Jamaica currently has employment opportunities for suitably qualified persons in the position of Aviation Firefighter (Airport Protection Assistant Grade²) at the Negril and Tinson Pen Aerodromes, and Ian Fleming and Norman Manley International Airports.

Scope of Responsibility

After an initial six months period of training, the successful candidates will, among other things, be expected to respond to aircraft emergencies and structural fires at the airport and its environs; provide emergency and first aid care on the airport; and other related and preventative duties.

Firefighters must be physically able to perform their duties while wearing personal protective equipment; must demonstrate physical endurance and agility in performing hazardous tasks under emergency conditions, and think and act judiciously in emergencies.

Minimum Qualifications & Experience

- 5 OX/GCE O'levels, including English Language, Mathematics and a Science subject
- Training as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), and/or in First Aid and Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) would be an asset
- Working knowledge of emergency response and security-related equipment and techniques
- Eighteen (18) months' work experience preferably in the military, Jamaica Constabulary Force or an industrial organisation
- Be the holder of an open Public Passenger Vehicle (PPV)/Commercial Motor Carrier (CMC) general driver's licence with specialized manual dexterity and practical skills
- Skills in vehicle maintenance would be an asset
- Be between the ages of 18 and 30 years and a minimum height of 5'7"
- Possess a Clean Police record
